Breakfast around the world: How different places start the day

When it comes to breakfast foods around the world, there are as many ways to enjoy the first meal of the day as there are to say "good morning."

From creamy cornbread cake in Brazil to creamy tarts in Portugal, these specialties offer a <u>food</u> option for every palate.



BRAZIL

If you can't stop eating pao de queijo, the puffy baked cheese rolls that are an icon of Brazilian culture, you'll be happy to know you can eat them for breakfast, too.

But for a variation on Brazilian breakfast breads, try bolo de fuba. It's a cornbread-style cake with a moist and creamy texture that comes from the addition of grated Parmesan cheese and/or shredded coconut. Sliced and served like a pound cake, it's frequently an afternoon pick-me-up too.

PORTUGAL

Coffee drinks with lots of milk are the first order of business when getting breakfast in Portugal. Uma mei de leite, a half-and-half blend of coffee and milk, or um galao, which is mostly milk with a shot of coffee, are an easy way to ease into the day.



Though many Portuguese have a simple piece of toast or bread alongside their drink, the perfect pairing for these milky coffees are pasteis de nata, or egg custard tarts.


